


## Small Fridges Make Good Cities

## Galley House

Urban-infill / Single-family Detached Residence 70 Galley Avenue, Toronto, Canada

Situated on a long, narrow 'leftover' lot, this home occupies a once-neglected site – its basic lot configuration having not matched a 'desirable' architecture in the mind of the market. The challenge: how a slender detached urban house type in Toronto might still offer good space, natural light, and views (inside and outside).

Through an *incremental urbanism*, the Galley House aims to be an architectural/typological expression of Toronto's desire for a healthy, dense, urban lifestyle.
